


Emergency Care System Continuum of Care


EMS Service License Types and Characteristics



EMS & Trauma Care Regions



The EMS & Trauma Care Steering Committee



- Advises DOH on EMS and trauma care
- Reviews regional EMS and trauma care plans
- Reviews proposed rules and recommends modifications
- 30-member committee appointed by the Secretary of Health
- Includes emergency physicians, trauma surgeons, nurses, EMTs, Fire Chiefs, and local government officials

DOH EMS Office

- Support public policy and rulemaking
- Licensing / Certification
- Provide oversight and guidance to MPDs
- EMS state & regional planning
- Develop guidance, education, and training
